Surveys suggest that more than half of parents feel that they are aware of what their children are doing online but 70% of teens say their parents don't know what they are doing.

With the talented Ben leading the way, he managed to transfix the pupils from minute one, and by the end of the day had every single child helping to produce an inspiring performance that took us through 300 years of British history.

It was a fantastic day enjoyed by all involved. A special thank you as well to all of the hard work that obviously went into creating and providing costumes, they looked amazing! Thanks also to our PTFA who paid for this event.





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Looking ahead to next week, we have the first set of mock SATs for our year 6 pupils. These mocks are low stakes assessments designed to ensure the children are familiar with the format and conventions of formal testing and also provide teachers with invaluable feedback about which previously taught subject areas need further input and where additional support may be required. The tests will be taking place in their English and Maths lessons.

Thank you to everyone who sent in shoeboxes for the Rotary Club's Shoebox Appeal. The boxes were collected this morning and will go to disadvantaged and displaced children.
