Improving school attendance is everyone's business and, to tackle the challenge we face, we need to work together. From January 2024, The Government is launching a national campaign to remind parents and carers of the importance of school.



We wish to highlight to parents, as it states in our policy, that any child

whose attendance is consistently below 90% will not have absences authorised without medical evidence, unless there are exceptional reasons which render this inappropriate (for example, a known medical condition); school cannot routinely authorise absence where a child's attendance has reached this level of concern. Please continue to notify the school of any absences but please be aware that this does not automatically authorise their absence. Your child's current attendance percentage will appear on their school report being emailed to parents today.

As always, if you wish to discuss any aspect of attendance support, please contact your child's tutor in the first instance and then their Head of Year. In the meantime, please do take a look at our website page on attendance and follow our new link, which holds useful information and guidance.

Industry Visit - Careers in Space

He also talked about current projects such as clearing up debris from space and solar panels being fitted to satellites which could send energy back to Earth. He also talked about STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) careers and talked about the three British astronauts who are being trained by NASA. The most exciting part of the presentation was watching rockets being launched from Scotland. Here are some comments from Year 5:

"It made me want to find out about jobs in space".
