## Attendance

We wish to remind parents, as it states in our policy, that any child whose attendance is consistently below 90% will not have absences authorised without medical evidence, unless there are exceptional reasons which render this inappropriate (for example, a known medical condition); school cannot routinely authorise absence where a child's attendance has reached this level of concern. Please continue to notify the school daily of any absences but please be aware that this does not automatically authorise their absence. Thank you to parents who have been sending in medical notes.

This week Year 7's have been conducting food tests. They were testing different foods for Starch, Glucose, Protein, and Fats. This shows them conducting the Benedict Glucose test.





## Netball
